



TYPES OF FINANCIAL AID – LPN TO RN TRANSITIONS

St. Joseph School of Nursing participates in federal funding programs such as the Pell Grant, Federal subsidized and unsubsidized Stafford loans, and the Parent Plus loan, to help students cover the cost of their education. The information below indicates how much a student may be eligible to receive in Federal aid for the duration of the program.

CHARGES FOR SUMMER SEMESTER 2010

Tuition & fees – May 2010 - August 2010 (8 credits) **Total \$3,131**

HOW TO APPLY & ELIGIBILITY: to be eligible for any of the Federal Aid programs a student must:

- Be a US citizen or legal permanent resident
- Be admitted to the program
- Complete the 2009/2010 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) using your completed 2008 IRS income tax returns (if you are a dependent, you need to have your parent's 2008 IRS income tax returns) on line at www.fafsa.ed.gov. **Our federal school code is 015016.** Note: If you have any problems completing the FAFSA, call 1-800-433-3243 for customer support.
- Be enrolled at least half time (6 credits)
- Not be in default or owe a refund on a federal grant or loan

Any amount of tuition not covered by financial aid is the responsibility of the student and is due prior to the first day of classes for each semester.

 Spring Semester tuition & fees – January – May 2011 (13 credits) **\$5,391**

Total program cost: \$14,723

HOW TO APPLY AND ELIGIBILITY: The 2010/2011 FAFSA can be completed after January 1, 2010. To be eligible for any of the Federal Aid programs a student must:

- Be a US citizen or legal permanent resident
- Be admitted to the program
- Complete the **2010/2011** Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) using your 2009 federal income tax returns (if you are a dependent, you need to have your parent's 2009 IRS income tax returns). Apply on line at www.fafsa.ed.gov. **Our Federal school code is 015016.** If you have any problems completing the FAFSA, call 1-800-433-3243 for customer support.
- Be enrolled at least half time (6 credits)
- Not be in default or owe a refund on a federal grant or loan
- Have financial need as determined by established federal formulas when the student has completed the FAFSA form.

Additional aid not administered by the financial aid office:

State Scholarships are funded and awarded by the state in which the student resides. The deadline for the 2010/2011 year is May 1, 2010. There are other requirements set by each individual state that must be met in order to be eligible for grants. The state grant office usually notifies students of their eligibility when they apply using the free federal form.
